AFFIDAVIT

- 1. I, J. Richard Lytle am a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and I make this affidavit in support of the government's Motion for Appointment of Interim Trustee in the above cases. I have been a Special Agent for the FBI for approximately 15 years. I am presently assigned to the FBI field office in Alexandria, Virginia and have been for the past five (5) years.
- 2. I hold a Bachelor of Science degree in accounting. Prior to my employment with the FBI, I worked in both the public and private sector in the field of accounting. I am familiar with the types of records commonly maintained by businesses and, in my career with the FBI, have been primarily responsible for financial investigations.
- 3. I have recently been assigned to an investigation of the financial activities of Caucus Distributors, Inc., Campaigner Publications, Inc., and Fusion Energy Foundation, Inc. in connec-

tion with the refusal of those organizations to pay civil contempt fines imposed by the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts.

- 4. As part of my investigation, Thave reviewed various records seized pursuant to a search warrant executed on October 6, 1986 at offices located at 20 South King Street, Leesburg, Virginia and at 722 Market Street, Leesburg, Virginia. The offices searched in the execution of that search warrant included the offices of Campaigner Publications, Inc. and other organizations controlled by political extremist Lyndon H. LaRouche, Jr.
- 5. I have also reviewed the affidavit of FBI Special Agent Richard J. Egan in support of the aforementioned search warrant and the affidavit of Deputy Donald L. Moore, Jr. of the Loudoun County Sherriff's Department executed on March 26, 1987.
- 6. I have also reviewed certain documents derived from material seized in the October 6, 1986 search. During that search, numerous Wang computer disk packs were seized from the offices of Columbus Data Systems which I know based on a review of other documents to be another organization controlled by Lyndon H. LaRouche, Jr. These disk packs were copied in February, 1987 and all information stored on the disk packs was printed out by FBI Special Agent Timothy Klund.
- 7. The information set forth in this affidavit is based on my review of the material described in paragraphs 4 through 6 above and upon-conversations with FBI Special Agent Klund and IRS Special Agent Lawrence Lucey. I have worked with them on other cases and I know them to be reliable.

- 8. One of the documents printed out was one bearing the name "PEI Report" and given Document Identification number 2203 L by its author. A true copy of the PEI Report is attached hereto as Exhibit A. That document identifies "PEI" to be an abbreviation for Publication Equities, Inc., another LaRouche organization.
- 9. The PEI Report summarizes various expenses paid to various entities both by PEI and on behalf of PEI during 1984 and 1985. It is my belief that the PEI Report shows substantial and continuous payments on behalf of PEI by the debtors in these actions.
- 10. With respect to Campaigner Publications, Inc., the PEI Report reveals that the debtor made the following payments on behalf of PEI. During 1984 and 1985 Campaigner paid a total of \$1,904,941 on behalf of PEI. Some of the larger transactions are:
 - a) \$200,000 paid on June 12, 1984 to Charles Ottinger, Agent, with a notation that the money was for a land purchase at Cardinal Park. I know from other documents I have reviewed in this investigation that Lots 5 & 6 in the Cardinal Park Industrial Development were acquired in 1984 by an entity known as Lafayette Leesburg Limited Partnership under the trusteeship of Edward Spannaus and J. S. Morrison. I know Mr. Spannaus to be a member of the LaRouche organization and I know that his wife, Nancy Spannaus, is a director of Campaigner Publications, Inc.
 - b) \$168,753.63 paid on June 19, 1984 to Ottinger with a notation that the money was for a land purchase at Cardinal Park.

- c) \$260,000 paid July 5, 1984 to Danbar Unlimited with a notation that the money was for a land purchase in Southern Virginia.
- d) \$50,000 paid June 26, 1984 to King & Cornwall with a notation that the money was a deposit for the purchase of property known as Ibykus Farms. I know from other documents I have reviewed that Ibykus Farms is the Leesburg, Virginia estate where LaRouche lives.
- 11. With respect to Fusion Energy Foundation, Inc., the PEI Report reveals that the debtor paid \$28,000 on behalf of PEI on September 28, 1984 to Ottinger with a notation that the money was for mortgage closing on the purchase of "Project: Bookstore."
- 12. With respect to Caucus Distributors, Inc., the PEI Report reveals that the debtor paid a total of \$220,076 on behalf of the PEI during 1984 and 1985. Some of the larger transactions were:
 - \$6,876.95 paid on December 20, 1984 to "Willetts." I know from a review of the PEI Report that a "Thom and Fangette-Willett" held a \$325,000 mortgage for land known as Sweetwater. I know from a review of other documents that Sweetwater Farm is owned by PEI. I know from the review of the PEI Report that monthly mortgage payments were scheduled to be \$3,354.61 and I believe the above payment represents two months of payments plus a late charge.
 - b) \$1,330 paid on March 9, April 12, April 19, April 28 and June 7, 1985 to Walter Wright. These payments total \$7,980. I know from a review of the PEI Report that a Walter Wright loaned \$40,000 to be used as a portion of

terms of the loan required weekly payments to Wright in the amount of \$1,330.

- c) \$11,165 paid on March 21, 1935 to James Hinkle. I know from a review of the PEI Report that James Hinkle holds a second mortgage on the purchase of "Project: Bookstore" and the monthly payments on the second mortgage are \$11,165.
- 13. Another of the documents printed out was one bearing the name "Ibykus Improvements" and given Document Identification number 1090 G by its author. A true copy of Ibykus Improvements is attached hereto as Exhibit B.
- 14. The Ibykus Improvements report summarizes estate and farmland improvements made to the Ibykus Farm as of August 22, 1986.
- 15. With respect to Campaigner Publications, Inc., the report reveals that the debtor made the following payments, totalling \$79,845.19 for estate improvements:
 - a) \$67,692.43 for road_clearing and construction;
 - b) \$7,639.10 for security facilities; and
 - c) \$4,513.66 for culverts.
