In Dianetics, The Modern Science of Mental Health,

L. Ron Hubbard, the Founder of the Church of Scientology, wrote:

"Why people try to abort children is a problem which has its answer only in aberration

A society which suppresses sex as evil and which is so aberrated that any member of it will attempt an abortion is a society which is dooming itself to ever-rising insanity. For it is a scientific fact that abortion attempts are the most important factor in aberration. The child on whom the abortion is attempted is condemned to live with MURDERERS whom he reactively knows to be murderers through all his weak and helpless youth!"

L. Ron Hubbard, Dianetics, The Modern Science of Mental Health, Book Two, Chapt. 7, at p. 152 ((c) 1989 L. Ron Hubbard Library) (emphasis in original indicated by capitalization).

Hubbard goes on to state:

"Once the child is conceived, no matter how 'shameful' the circumstances, no matter the MORES, no matter the income, that man or woman who would attempt an abortion on an unborn child is attempting a murder which will seldom succeed and is laying the foundation of a childhood of illness and heartache."

Dianetics, Book Two, Chapt. 7, at p. 152 (emphasis in original indicated by capitalization).

According to the Church of Scientology, not only is the woman a murderer, but any doctor who recommends or performs an abortion (or presumably a Judge who approves same for a minor) must be removed from practice or office. Hubbard writes:

"Anyone attempting an abortion is committing an act against the whole of society and the future; any judge or doctor recommending an abortion should be instantly deprived of position and practice, whatever his 'reason.'"

Dianetics, Book Two, Chapt. 7, at p. 153.

L. Ron Hubbard and the Church of Scientology have also determined all of the other "moral" and behavioral characteristics of a women who have abortions. In Science of Survival, Prediction of Human Behavior, Hubbard established a "tone scale" for classifying individuals and evaluating human behavior. See generally L. Ron Hubbard, Science of Survival, Prediction of Human Behavior, Book One, Chapt. 1 ((c) 1951 L. Ron Hubbard). The tone scale ranges from -3 at the bottom (death), to +4 at the top. See id. Any woman who has an abortion falls, at best, at "1.1" on this tone scale:

"At 1.1, a mother will attempt the abortion of her child; and any woman who will abort a child, save only if the child threatens her physical life (rather than her

reputation), lies in the 1.1 bracket or below. She can be expected to be unreliable, inconstant and promiscuous; and the child is looked upon as evidence of this promiscuity."

Science of Survival, Book One, Chapt. 18, at 118.

Once a woman has had an abortion, and thus demonstrated that she falls at 1.1 (or below) on the Church of Scientology tone scale, the Church believes it can predict all of her other behavioral and "moral" characteristics. Hubbard states:

"At 1.1 on the tone scale we enter the area of the most vicious reversal of the second dynamic. Here we have promiscuity, perversion, sadism, and irregular practices."

Science of Survival, Book One, Chapt. 18, at 116.

For future reference, in the world of the Church of Scientology: "Dynamic two is the urge of the individual toward ultimate survival via the sex act, the creation of and the rearing of children." See Dianetics, Book 1, Chapt. 4, at p. 43. "This dynamic would normally be called sex." See Science of Survival, Book One, Chapt. 18, at p. 114.

According to the Church of Scientology, anyone at "1.1" on the tone scale, such as women who have had (or have attempted to have) an abortion, are dangerous in the extreme:

"People on this level on the second dynamic are intensely dangerous in the society, since aberration is contagious. A society which reaches this level is on its way out of history, as went the Greeks, as went the Romans, as goes modern European and American culture. Here is a flaming danger signal which must be heeded if a race is to go forward."

Science of Survival, Book One, Chapt. 18, at 116.

Scientology, and its Founder, L. Ron Hubbard, teach that one should not, and indeed cannot, trust a "1.1." This is because: "Around 1.1, we reach the level of covert hostility." See Science of Survival, Book One, Chapt. 8, at 56. To be more precise:

"The person may claim to love others and to have the good of others as his foremost interest; yet, at the same moment, he works, unconsciously or otherwise, to injure or destroy the lives and reputations of people and also to destroy property."

Science of Survival, Book One, Chapt. 8, at p. 56. Hubbard further explains:

"At 1.1, we have lying, to avoid real communication. * * * Here is the level of covert hostility, the most dangerous and wicked level on the tone scale. Here is the person who smiles while he inserts a knife blade between your vertebrae. * * * Here is the insincere flatterer who yet awaits only a moment of unguardedness to destroy. * * * This is the level of the pervert "

Science of Survival, Book 1, Chapt. 13, at 88-89. Such a person "has only two purposes: to wreak the most harm upon others, and secure the greatest safety for self." See Science of Survival, Book 1, Chapt. 22, at 136.

For Hubbard and the Church of Scientology, the danger posed by "1.1" cannot be underestimated. Indeed:

"From 1.3 down to 0.6 we have the general area of the subversive, who promises a people freedom and equality and gives them

a slaughter of their best minds and cultural institutions, to the end of a totalitarian dominance."

Science of Survival, Book 1, Chapt. 27, at 163.

According to Hubbard and the Church of Scientology, given this danger posed by "1.1s," society is faced with only one choice:

"No social order which desires to survive dares overlook its stratum 1.1's. No social order will survive which does not remove these people from its midst."

Science of Survival, Book 1, Chapt. 13, at 90. To Hubbard and the Church of Scientology, the final solution is a simple one:

"Such people should be taken from the society as rapidly as possible and uniformly institutionalized; for here is the level of the contagion of immorality, and the destruction of ethics;"

Science of Survival, Book 1, Chapt. 13, at 89.

On the other hand, the Church of Scientology offers an alternative final solution:

"The only answers would seem to be the permanent quarantine of such persons from society to avoid the contagion of their insanities and the general turbulence which they bring to any order, thus forcing it lower on the scale, or processing such persons until they have attained a level on the tone scale which gives them value."

Science of Survival, Book 1, Chapt. 21, at 131. Thus, the Church offers a choice to women who are considering abortion. Such women can avoid being quarantined or institutionalized by

simply undergoing Church "processing" to raise their tone level to that "which gives them value."

Finally, while the Hubbard and the Church of Scientology have determined that "1.1s" are dangerous in the extreme, it appears they have also concluded that the threat "1.1s" pose can be easily dealt with. This is because:

"At 1.1, we have reached fear, on the tone scale, and when the individual rises above fear we have underhanded displays of action. If the individual is suddenly addressed by danger, however, we have cowardice."

Science of Survival, Book 1, Chapt. 23, at 141.
